School's Out

With the fast-paced evolution of information technology in modern classrooms, new design opportunities and challenges are continually arising. In our office we engage in plenty of education-based projects and we enjoy developing contemporary spaces that can support evolving pedagogies in innovative learning environments.

The solution for each school is unique to the physical context and learning framework. Our projects are focused on creating rich and varied interconnecting built environments that can facilitate a wide range of learning activities to supplement the important role that is still played by traditional classrooms.

The recently completed Christian Brothers College Centre for Innovation is a good example of this approach. The project architect Associate Kon Michael worked closely with our BIM Manager Josh Budarick for this multi-disciplinary 'STEaM' building: to develop the distinctive 'wrap-around' geometric façade on Wakefield Street.

Also recently opened is the new \$19.9M Pedare Christian College 'One Campus' Performing Arts, Junior School, Middle School and Gymnasium, managed by Director Simon Best. This project enabled the school to deliver a curriculum across all years from the one Surrey Farm Drive campus by incorporating Pedare's Junior School campus, previously located at Bicentennial Drive. Central to the project were principles of community inclusiveness, sustainability and technology, wrapped into a STEM-oriented outcome. The team's close relationship developed with the school was central to delivery of the integrated architectural, interiors and landscape solution.

Finally, we have the recently completed New Senior School STEM and Leadership Hub at Seymour College. This project involved a complete refurbishment and new extension to the Eastern Wing of the Abbie Building to create a dedicated facility for Senior School Learning. Delivering new Laboratories, classrooms, a Senior Learning Commons, film studio and edit suite along with a new Senior School Reception, this project has fulfilled the first stage in the redevelopment of Seymour's Senior Precinct and supports Seymour's ground-breaking Senior School program, Independence.
