The vertex of apartment living

When invited by Peet to design the new apartment development taking pride-of-place on MAB Circuit in Tonsley Village, we were only too keen.

Whilst the site offered many opportunities for inspiration it also threw up some rather difficult challenges. Our initial site context study revealed level differences of over 2 metres along the site's interface with MAB Circuit.

To reconcile these levels, our landscape team developed a series of landscaped terraces which are cleverly designed to eliminate the need for balustrades and guard-railing whilst providing ground floor courtyards and living spaces with solar access. The landscape design also proposes the integration of vertical gardens using trellis wires and screens with climbing plants to provide privacy to ground floor

courtyards and provide greening of pedestrian pathways. Overall the integration of the landscaping complements the existing planting along MAB Circuit providing a high level of amenity at the ground floor interface and front door to the apartments.

Through our planning studies for the site we were able to realise an additional 12 apartments over the same footprint of other apartment projects at Tonsley. Through the efficiency of the site planning, we were also able to provide car parking spaces for each apartment plus additional parking spaces for visitors.

The design of the streetscape interface along MAB Circuit was carefully considered. Rather than designing a series of interconnected apartment buildings, our response was to provide separation between the apartment buildings to break down the mass. This allowed visual connectivity whilst prioritising pedestrian movement through the site for improved connections to the Tonsley Innovation District.

Giving the illusion of a row of townhouses, the design is inspired by the form of the sawtooth roof of the Main Assembly Building (MAB) opposite. In turn, its form inspired the name - Vertex Apartments!
